## HASTINGS HIGH SCHOOL TRAP AND SKEET TEAM CAPTAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

- Captains should set up a group text and make enough weekly contact to be sure at least 3 captains will be at each shooting day. They need to communicate what days they can captain and if they can only work a portion of a day.
- Captains help on the fields with filling houses, dumping shells, dumping trashcans, etc. to include breaking down all cardboard. Broken down cardboard, shell casings and other trash to be taken to the dumpsters throughout the day. Important: One dumpster is for trash and shell casings and the other is for cardboard only.
- On days we are assigned to trap fields one and two, all trash cans in the clubhouse including the bathrooms also need to be emptied and tables and chairs straightened. If needed, floors are to be swept.
- Captains will close out the day filling clay target transport vehicles with clay targets stored in sheds, moving to field houses and filling houses. Some days this process may also take place during our shooting time. Always, show common sense and be safe when operating 3M's transport vehicles and when inside a trap house.
- Captains need to help locating and making sure squads are ready to shoot at state championships.
- Captains need to interact with the new athletes to make them feel welcome, answer questions and provide guidance. We want new kids to know who our captains are and to feel comfortable about approaching them.
- Captains should set a good example at all times. This means you do not sit
  in your vehicles or fool around. Captains need to be prepared for bad
  weather and dress appropriately. Always drive slow and responsibly on 3M
  property.
- Captains automatically letter and can shoot unlimited extra rounds. However, extra rounds should not be shot when we are backed up or if you are needed on the fields.
- Captains are welcome to the water and snacks we keep in the trailer for coaches/volunteers.
- Captains are periodically called upon to assist with other projects at the gun club or with multiple types of volunteer work throughout the community.
